English Plus and English for the Future

Architecturally similar in style to Oxford and Cambridge universities, Lancing's magnificent Gothic buildings include a spectacular grand dining room and an impressive chapel, which is listed as a Building of National Importance. The site's hilltop location on the South Downs has views of the seaside town of Brighton and is just five minutes from Shoreham Airport, where students can learn to fly with our standout Flying Academy.

Lancing offers two flagship courses designed to appeal to teenagers aged 13–17. English for the Future will allow the students to develop their critical thinking and problem-solving skills through exploring the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and debating as future leaders how to take action and transform the world around them. English Plus will enable the students to improve their English skills, immerse themselves in the British culture and take part in engaging projects. In addition, students can create a more intensive study programme by choosing one Academic Academy per week in subjects such as Critical Thinking, Essay Writing or Psychology. Cambridge B1, B2 and C1 exam courses are also available in combination with the English Plus course for those wishing to obtain a recognised language qualification.

This fully-inclusive programme also features sports and activities every afternoon. A range of professional Sporting and Creative Academies are also available as extras.

The evening entertainment programme provides an opportunity for recreation and fun and is designed to bring students together in a sociable and stimulating way. Excursions enable students to visit places of interest. These can include a cultural visit to a castle, museum or palace, a visit to a popular tourist attraction such as Big Ben, the London Eye, Madame Tussauds, or something more recreational such as a trip to an aquarium, theme park or zoo.

ACCOMMODATION

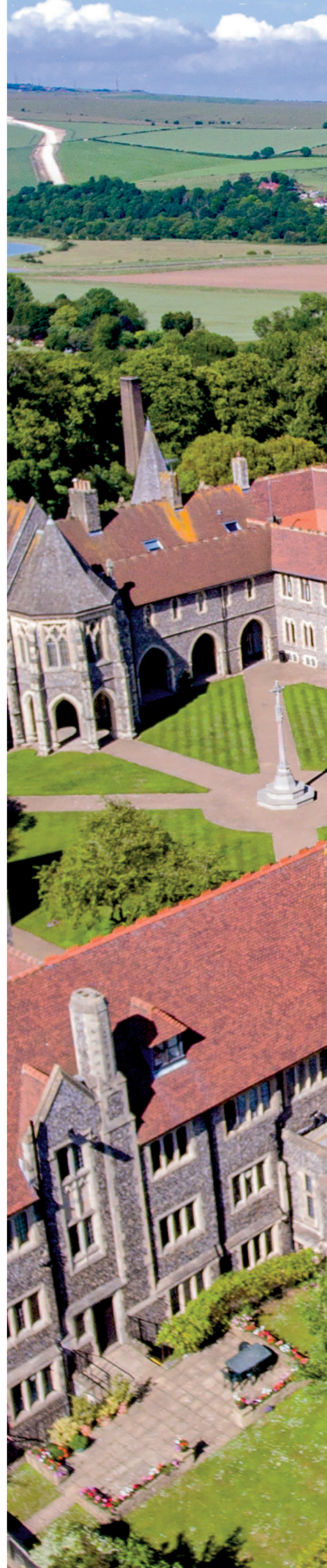

ENGLISH SKILLS

These lessons are designed to improve students' general language skills, extend their vocabulary and better their understanding of grammar, to improve accuracy and confidence when producing spoken and written English.

ENRICHMENT

During these sessions, students will further enrich their language skills by deepening their cultural understanding of the places they visit during excursions, using real-world materials such as leaflets, word searches, adverts and articles to develop their productive and receptive English skills pre- and post-excursions.

RESEARCH PROJECT

Throughout the course of the week, students do research around a weekly theme or topic of interest which they then present in an agreed way, such as a presentation, performance, song, product pitch or an art exhibition of their work. The aim of Research Project lessons is to develop students team and collaboration skills as well as improve their speaking and interpersonal skills.

ENGLISH FOR THE FUTURE

The morning English for the Future sessions develop the students' English language proficiency across the four skills with a particular focus on the global problems we are facing nowadays. Students will develop their presentation skills by watching TED Talks and preparing their own talks, as well as broadening their vocabulary related to sustainability and global issues.

FUTURE THINKING

These sessions prepare students for 'Friday for the Future' debates between two groups. Through a series of practical workshops on internet research and critical thinking, students will gather sufficient information on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and analyse it in order to offer practical solutions to global problems.

PROJECT FOR THE FUTURE

Over the course of a week, students will research and discuss one of the 2030 Agenda Sustainable Development Goals such as ending poverty and hunger, protecting the planet, promoting and fostering peace, achieving gender equality and empowering all women and girls. Then they will present their conclusions by way of writing a blog entry, producing a song, recording a podcast or preparing a digital presentation. These sessions aim to develop not only students' speaking and communication skills but also their social and interpersonal skills, as well as broaden their perspectives on life in the future.

There is a fun, competitive element to Project for the Future and every student in the winning class, judged by the Academic Manager or Centre Director, is recognised for their contribution and given a small prize.

Academies

CRITICAL THINKING

Bede's Critical Thinking Academy is for students who enjoy the critical examination of information and ideas. They will learn how to make rational judgements and in the process develop their ability to think independently, and to express their viewpoint.

ESSAY WRITING

Bede's Essay Writing Academy teaches more than grammar and spelling. Students learn key writing structures for specific genres, and how to organise their ideas as well as the language needed to present and support those ideas in a logical and engaging way.

PSYCHOLOGY

Bede's Psychology Academy is for students who are curious about how the mind works and why people behave the way they do. Through interactive sessions and real-life case studies, students will explore key psychological theories and gain a deeper understanding of human thought, emotion and behaviour.

MASTERCHEF

Bede's Masterchef Academy is designed for students who have a passion for food and who enjoy cooking. The classes are fun and informative, giving students the confidence to be hands-on with raw produce and kitchen equipment. In each session, students create a dish inspired by a different international cuisine.



E-KART RACING

Bede's E-Kart Racing Academy offers students the chance to experience the thrill of electric kart racing while learning the fundamentals of speed, control, and strategy. Students will develop their driving skills and improve their reflexes in a safe and controlled environment. Whether aiming for fun or pursuing competitive racing, this academy provides an exciting introduction to the world of motorsport.

FLYING

Bede's Flying Academy offers students an opportunity to pilot an aircraft. Students will have a trained pilot in attendance for the 45-minute flight ensuring that they are able to take control of the aircraft should they need to. The main goal of this academy is to help students gain an understanding of how to pilot an aircraft and can help them with future flying lessons.

GOLF

Bede's Golf Academy is for students wishing to improve their golf technique supported by a professional instructor. The lessons will focus on developing the student's skills and knowledge of the game, practising and analysing the mechanics of the golf swing. Students will also broaden their vocabulary specifically relating to golf.

HORSE RIDING

Students on the Bede's Horse Riding Academy will have a riding lesson and rides in the local countryside, under close supervision. The instructors are experienced in teaching young children for whom this may be their first time on a horse as well as catering for more advanced riders. Students also have the opportunity to learn about caring for horses, grooming and stable management after their rides. Student height, weight, and experience level are required for this academy.

TENNIS

Bede's Tennis Academy offers students the opportunity to improve their tennis skills and technique, supported by a professional instructor. Sessions will specifically look at offensive and defensive actions as well as how to position on court and improve their tennis ability.

Business Leadership

This intensive two-week programme, available at Lancing, combines classroom-based teaching with practical visits to business organisations during specialised mid-week excursions.

Bede's Business Leadership course is designed to equip students with the essential skills and mindset needed to become a future leader in the dynamic world of business. Whether considering a career in finance, marketing, entrepreneurship, or management, this programme offers a unique opportunity to gain practical experience and theoretical knowledge in a fun, engaging, and collaborative environment.

Bede's students will not only develop core business knowledge but also acquire crucial 'soft skills' that are vital for success. Throughout the course, students will learn to communicate effectively, solve problems, and negotiate confidently. Through collaborative projects, students will enhance their teamwork abilities and learn how to motivate and inspire others. This comprehensive approach ensures students are not just learning theory but actively building the practical skills needed to lead with confidence and make a real impact.

PROGRAMME

Available in Lancing, the course includes 20 hours of classroom tuition each week, a fully guided visit to an organisation to gain an insight into the day-to-day reality of running a business and the opportunity to meet a guest speaker from the corporate world.

All sessions are delivered in English with a focus on broadening Business English vocabulary and technical language for course content.

COURSE CONTENT

Students will explore a variety of themes relating to Business Leadership, from Entrepreneurship, Marketing, Human Resources and Finance which will enable them to dive into the world of Business as well as improve their general English language skills, practise communication and build confidence.

Entrepreneurship

Students will create an entrepreneurial mindset as they learn to identify opportunities, take calculated risks, and innovate to create their own ventures.

Business Startup

Students will gain practical knowledge and skills to transform a great idea into a viable business, from crafting a business plan to securing funding.

Marketing

Students will master the art of promoting products and services, understanding consumer behaviour, and building a strong brand presence in a competitive market.

Human Resources

Students will discover the crucial role of managing a company's most valuable asset – its people – by exploring topics like recruitment, training, and team development.

Finance

Students will learn to read financial statements, manage budgets, and make sound financial decisions that drive business growth and profitability.

Operations

Students will explore the inner workings of an organisation, optimising processes and managing resources to ensure efficiency and successful day-to-day operations.

COURSE OUTCOMES

Students receive a Bede's Certificate in Business Leadership.

TYPICAL DAY

Business Leadership students receive 20 hours of tuition per week. These are split into 4 sessions a day except for Wednesday when students depart on a fully guided visit to a business organisation and take part in an outside of the classroom workshop.
