Overview of Bucksmore syllabus: Intensive English classes & 21st Century Skills

Language Study

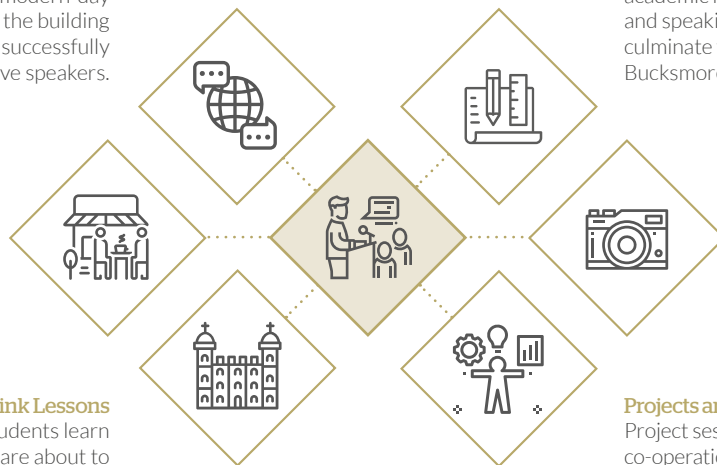
Through topics specifically designed for junior learners, the syllabus focuses on contemporary English. It integrates all language skills but focuses on speaking and listening. Students work on grammar as well as lexical areas in a modern-day context. Language study supplies the building blocks students need to communicate successfully with native and non-native speakers.

Language in Use

Students are put in real-life situations to communicate in a meaningful and authentic way. This allows students to activate the language found in their course books in an everyday scenario. Language in Use classes develop fluency and communication skills, building students' confidence and knowledge of English.

Excursion Link Lessons

Before full-day excursions, students learn about the destinations they are about to visit. Lessons cover local history, culture of the area and vocabulary relating to the landmarks they will see.



Academic Skills

The academic skills classes give students an introduction to exam techniques and are intended to help students improve the skills of academic reading, writing, listening and speaking. These sessions culminate with students taking the Bucksmore Assessment.

Electives

After arriving, students sign up for a choice of vocational subjects to enhance their English usage through different topics such as creative writing, and IELTS preparation.

Note – exact subjects vary slightly between Oxford and London.

Projects and mini-projects

Project sessions encourage group work and co-operation across all levels of English. Students are encouraged to work collaboratively, completing shared tasks by using English with an authentic purpose. Each weekly project ends with a presentation evening, during which all groups display and present their work.

IELTS Preparation

Exam preparation with English language learning

• Ages 16–18

This programme combines bespoke English language learning with focused preparation for the IELTS examination, which is often required for entrance into UK universities. The programme develops key insights and knowledge surrounding the IELTS examination content, marking criteria and examination skills.

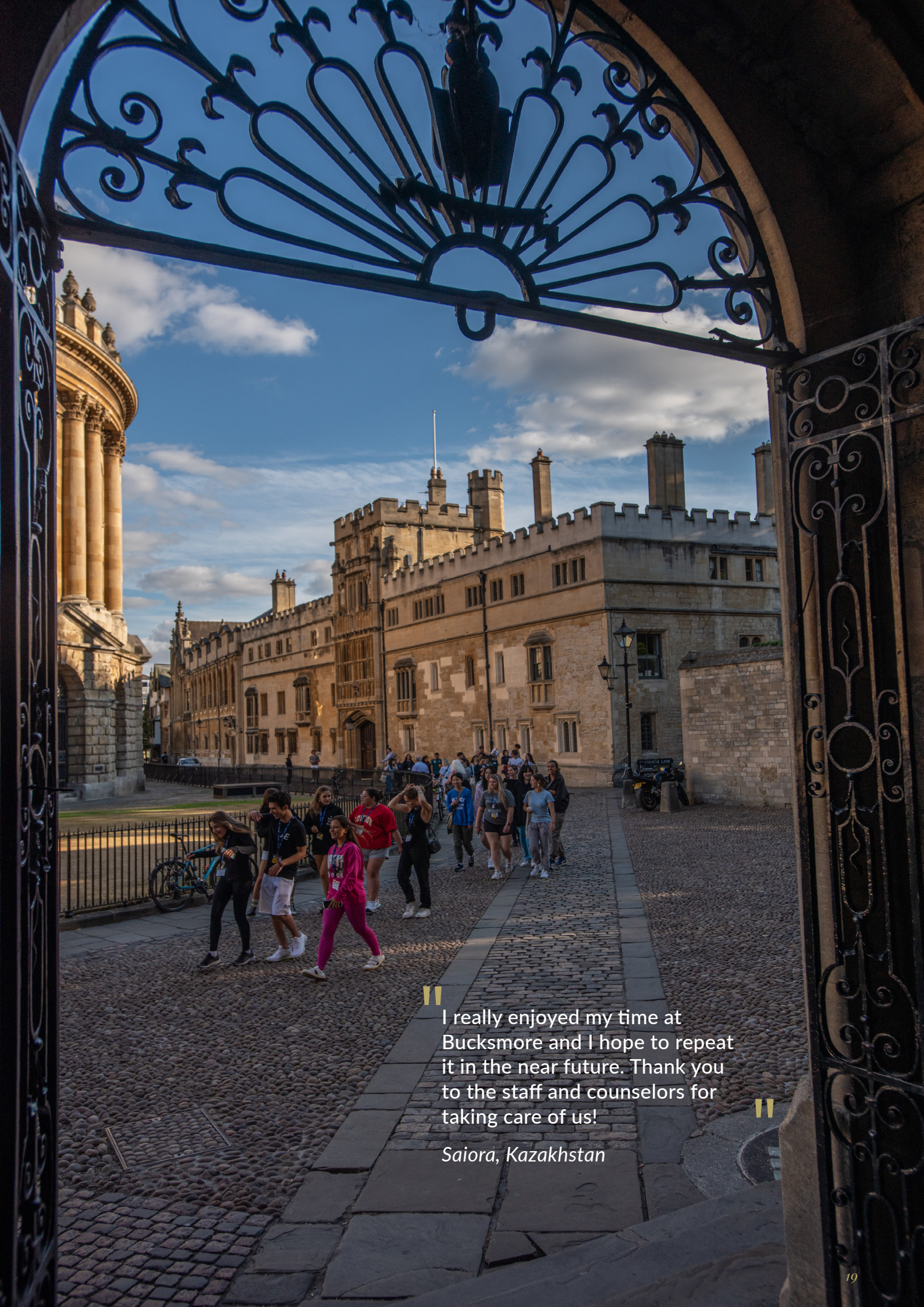

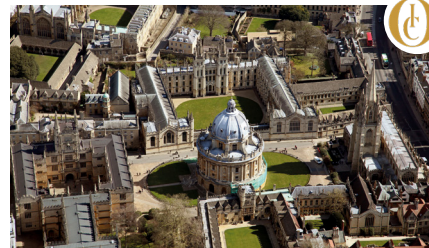
