Pastoral Care & Safeguarding

Our Nord Anglia Advisory Board helps Bucksmore ensure that everything we do is underpinned by the commitment to provide the utmost care and safety of our students.

At Bucksmore, several of our senior Managers are English UK qualified Designated Safeguarding Leads (DsL) one of which assumes overall responsibility for the Summer. Their remit centres around raising awareness within the organisation of issues relating to the welfare of children and young people, and the promotion of a safe environment of the children and young people on Bucksmore programmes. The DsL is supported by Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead (DDSL).



All members of staff in our centres complete compulsory safeguarding training before they can work on our courses. They also receive intensive in-person training with members of Head Office before the course starts, to ensure all protocols and policies are maintained throughout the summer. Each course has at least 2 first-aid trained members of staff to attend to any injuries or health issues.

We uphold high staff to student ratios to ensure all students are known and their physical and mental well-being is catered for throughout their time with us. There is an on-site management team available 24 hours a day including first-aid trained members of staff. As a result, we are very well placed to ensure our courses and venues have strong protocols in place to ensure students have a safe and enjoyable experience.

Train with one of the world's top football academies this summer, Inter Academy. For active students who are passionate about sport, our Football & English course offers the chance to experience on-field training, sports performance and English language workshops.

The coaching programme is designed and delivered by Inter Academy coaches, building on students' techniques and skills. Our English curriculum allows students to learn English through sport, and has been created to provide knowledge, skills and confidence for players to communicate both on and off field.

Students will leave this programme with a full English language progress report and Inter Academy certificate of attendance.

Learning outcomes

- Develop key language skills: speaking, listening, reading and writing, as well as lexical resource, grammatical structures and pronunciation
- Build confidence in communicating in English and using English in authentic situations
- Improve knowledge of sports performance and vocabulary and how to express yourself on the pitch in English

Our bespoke English language curriculum focuses on providing the knowledge, skills and confidence for students to communicate effectively both on and off the field.

Content will cover language needed for day-to-day life on the camp and training sessions so students are able to use their language immediately and communicate with international teammates and coaches.



Workshops

Students will attend 2 football workshops per week delivered by the Inter Academy coaches that focus on such topics as:

- The history of Inter Milan
- Football tactics and philosophies
- What makes great players great
- What it takes to be a professional footballer



Projects

Students will also learn about the key elements of football through a project based learning approach focusing on areas such as:

- Food & Nutrition
- Injury prevention
- Sports performance
- Player attributes
- Stadium design



Football

The curriculum is designed and delivered by Inter Milan Academy coaches, a direct extension of the Italian professional football club Inter Milan's Youth Sector training program. The goal of the Inter Academy training is to provide theoretical and practical skills so that each student is able to learn in an effective and rational way and transfer their technical "know-how" to future matches.

Throughout training, coaches will focus on **5 key areas of development** that will help build players into champions:

- 1. Physical-Coordinative Area
- 2. Technical-Tactical Area
- 3. Social Area
- 4. Psychological-Motivational Area
- 5. Medical Area

At the end of each week, students will take part in a tournament to put their newly developed skills into action!

Discover our Intensive English course



Located in world-famous universities, these programmes are for enthusiastic students who want to accelerate their learning experience by putting their language skills into practice through varied learning styles and authentic workshops such as drama, debating and English literature.

Overview of Bucksmore syllabus:

Intensive English classes & 21st Century Skills



Language Study

Through topics specifically designed for junior learners, the syllabus focuses on contemporary English. It integrates all language skills but focuses on speaking and listening. Students work on grammar as well as lexical areas in a modernday context. Language study supplies the building blocks students need to communicate successfully with native and non-native speakers.



Language in Use

Students are put in real-life situations to communicate in a meaningful and authentic way. This allows students to activate the language found in their course books in an everyday scenario. Language in Use classes develop fluency and communication skills, building students' confidence and knowledge of English.



Excursion Link Lessons

Before full-day excursions, students learn about the destinations they are about to visit. Lessons cover local history, culture of the area and vocabulary relating to the landmarks they will see.



Academic Skills

The academic skills classes give students an introduction to exam techniques and are intended to help students improve the skills of academic reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. These sessions culminate with students taking the Bucksmore Assessment.



Electives

After arriving, students sign up for a choice of vocational subjects to enhance their English usage through different topics such as creative writing, and IELTS preparation.

Note – exact subjects vary slightly between Oxford and London.



Projects and mini-projects

Project sessions encourage group work and co-operation across all levels of English.
Students are encouraged to work collaboratively, completing shared tasks by using English with an authentic purpose. Each weekly project ends with a presentation evening, during which all groups display and present their work.





Mathematics

Our Mathematics course introduces university-level mathematics in a variety of theoretical and applied modelling. The course covers essential foundations of the advanced study of mathematics, physics and analysis of data via topics such as algebra and calculus, as well as probability and statistics. Students will explore real-life phenomena through logical reason and learn how to analyse problems, propose hypotheses, and test solutions. Students will gain key transferable skills which will support further studies in engineering, physics, computer science, and more.

Pre-Law

Delivered at first year Undergraduate level, our Law course introduces law from a theory-based perspective, including jurisprudence, legal institutions, and the limits of legal recourse. Students will explore domestic and international law, including reflecting on recent international events from different legal perspectives. This course will build foundational knowledge in criminal law, international law, humanitarian law, and other areas whilst building key skills such as negotiating and litigating. Students will have opportunities to apply their legal knowledge in practical and moot trial exercises with a global perspective, understanding how law is interpreted differently from historical and cultural contexts.



Psychology

During this two-week intensive course, students will explore a variety of academic disciplines related to psychology whilst building foundational knowledge of psychology and contemporary psychological research. Students will develop knowledge and understanding of the history of psychology and psychological research and learn how they can apply their knowledge in a range of contexts. Global Finance & Economics

Delivered at first year undergraduate level, our Global Finance & Economics course introduces essential frameworks of economics in a global context. The course introduces economics through the application of economic theory in the modern world, emphasising recent trends and developments and putting them in a historical perspective. Lessons will include theoretical analysis and study into core aspects of micro and macroeconomics in addition to theoretical study of economic theory, including studying works from Smith, Marx, Keynes, Friedman, and others. This course takes a global perspective on economics, including analysing international economic policy and case studies of specific countries and their use of Universal Basic Incomes, austerity policies, and tax policies.

International Relations & Global Governance

Delivered at the first-year undergraduate level, our International Relations & Global Governance course introduces contemporary issues in politics, international relations, and political theory. Students will explore the historical development and contemporary manifestations of politics on a global scale, including analysing international relations and diplomacy through the lenses of cultural exchange and economic trade. We will explore the idea of 'globalization' and its role as a political tool of expansion and suppression. Lastly, this course will develop strong analytical and critical thinking skills in multiple case studies through questioning the power of the people, human rights, and sovereignty.

Computer Science & Information Technology




